*NEW School Hoodie (PE only)



Attendance

It is vital that pupils attend **school**, on time, every day in order to gain the greatest benefit from their education. 95% - 100% (less than 10 days absence in a year) is **good attendance**. 95% is the national average **attendance** rate for a child at Primary School, we hope to achieve 97%. Without regular attendance, levels of attainment suffer and opportunities are missed to obtain maximum benefit from learning. Persistent absence and lateness will affect a child's achievement and progress in school.



As a school we have a duty to inform you of your child's absence and each term we will contact families whose children's attendance is below 90%. Our intention is to work closely with parents and carers to offer support and this is where our beloved Mrs Gooding comes in. Her role is to liaise and find solutions for families who maybe facing difficulties getting their children to school. Of course, we understand that children are sometimes poorly and need to stay at home. If this is the case please call school before 9am and speak with Mrs Gooding or the ladies in the Office.

Once we know the Government's decision regarding Covid19 restrictions, we will confirm the start and end of day school times for September 2021.

Behaviour

Archbishop Courtney has a very positive approach to behaviour. However, we expect all

children to behave with respect, kindness and courtesy-following our school values Aspiration, Compassion, Friendship, Respect and Resilience. To create a harmonious learning environment, where pupils are able to self-regulate their own behaviour and learning, we use restorative justice techniques to provide children with the opportunity to work together with an adult to resolve issues. The children have created their own behaviour expectations Be Ready, Be Respectful, Be Safel

A NEW Home School Agreement will be making its way to you very soon. We would be very grateful if all parents reinforced these expectations at home, to make sure all our richly unique and diverse children are safe, happy and resilient at school.

Finally, I would like to thank you all for your kindness and support. Both myself, the entire School Team, along with the School's Governing Body, are passionate about making Archbishop Courtenay Primary School a place of excellence for all our children.

This year has been a particularly challenging year for the whole world, let alone our school community, yet we have managed to make so many positive changes. Having such a dedicated team, I am more than confident the school will continue to flourish, especially with our parents supporting our ambitions – this alone makes such a difference to the morale and motivation of the staff and pupils. We will continue to offer a safe haven for all children; celebrate their differences and strive to prepare them for the next stage in their education by using our school and the British values to anchor them as model citizens.
