Archbishop Courtenay Primary School Uniform

Firstly, may I begin by thanking you all for making sure your son/daughter is wearing the correct school uniform. I know there were some issues in obtaining school branded items from Brigade, but I am informed these were the result of lockdown and any problems have now been remedied. However, if this is not the case please let me know. Some parents asked if Brigade would send clothing to school again so I am delighted to inform you we have organised this in the hope this makes life a little easier for you.

I am sure you are aware that our uniform policy consists of either a grey skirt, trousers, shorts or a pinafore however, there are occasions when children are wearing black items of clothing. As a parent myself, I am mindful that during lockdown certain items may not have been easily obtainable and because of this I am willing to compromise, but only for this academic year. Therefore, I will allow black clothing if it has already been bought. Nevertheless, if you need to make an in-year purchase please would you ensure you buy grey uniform – from September 2021 only grey uniform will be accepted.
