Attendance

It is vital that pupils attend school, on time, every day in order to gain the greatest benefit from their education. 95% - 100% (less than 10 days absence in a year) is **good attendance**. 95% is the national average attendance rate for a child at primary school, we hope to achieve 97%. Without regular attendance, levels of attainment suffer and opportunities are missed to obtain maximum benefit from learning. Persistent absence and lateness will affect a child's achievement and progress in school. *This will also involve the School Attendance Service*.

As a school we have a duty to inform you of your child's absence and each term we will contact families whose children's attendance is below 90%. Our intention is to work closely with parents and carers to offer support and this is where our beloved Mrs Gooding comes in. Her role is to liaise with families who maybe facing difficulties getting their children to school and find solutions to get the children learning. Of course, we understand that children are sometimes poorly and need to stay at home. If this is the case please call school before 9am and speak with Mrs Gooding.

Behaviour

Archbishop Courtney has a very positive approach to behaviour. However, we expect all children to behave with respect, kindness and courtesy-following our school values Aspiration, Compassion, Friendship, Respect and Resilience. To create a harmonious learning environment, where pupils are able to self-regulate their own behaviour and learning, we use restorative justice techniques to provide children with the opportunity to work together with an adult to resolve issues. The children have created their own behaviour expectations Be Ready, Be Respectful, Be Safel



A new Behaviour Policy will be created for September 2022. This will continue to support our school vision, providing a consistent approach to behaviour across all areas of the school and will include parental engagement.

Finally, I would like to thank you all for your support this academic year. Both myself, the entire teaching team, along with the school's Governing Body, are passionate about making Archbishop Courtenay a place of excellence for all our children. Your kindness is much appreciated and working together we will be successful on our journey!
