About this Resource:

We recommend these activities are used with mixed ability groups. They are designed to promote British Values by encouraging each group to discuss ideas, support each other and to be tolerant and respectful of the views and opinions of others.

The task is based on an application request for astronauts from NSA (National Space Agency), which the children must, through discussion, produce their own presentation/submission for selection. They must use the document to determine what the skills are that NSA are looking for. The application can only be submitted as a group and not from individuals. They must explain their reasons for why their group should be chosen for a space mission to the moon, thinking about the qualities they personally bring to the group.

National Curriculum Objectives:

English Year 1: Write sentences by saying out loud what they are going to write about. More resources with this objective.

English Year 2: Consider what they are going to write before beginning by planning or saying out loud what they are going to write about. More resources with this objective.

English Year 3 & Year 4: Plan their writing by discussing and recording ideas. More resources with this objective.

English Year 3 & Year 4: Read their own writing aloud to a group or the whole class, using appropriate intonation and controlling the tone and volume so that the meaning is clear. More resources with this objective.

English Year 5 & Year 6: Plan their writing by noting and developing initial ideas, drawing on reading and research where necessary. More resources with this objective.

English Year 5 & Year 6: Perform their own compositions, using appropriate intonation, volume, and movement so that meaning is clear. More resources with this objective.

Differentiation:

CLASSROOM Secrets

Year 1 & Year 2 Create a bank of skills for astronauts from a given set of words. Allocate these attributes to each other and give reasons for their choice. Aimed at all abilities in Year 1 and Year 2. Year 3 & Year 4 Create a bank of characteristics needed for astronauts, choosing three as the most important. Allocate one skill that each individual would bring to the group. Prepare a short presentation of why NSA should choose their group. Aimed at all abilities in Year 3 and Year 4. Year 5 & Year 6 Create a bank of qualities and characteristics needed for astronauts, choosing five as the most important. Allocate two skills that each individual would bring to the group. Prepare a presentation of why NSA should choose their group, focussing on how individual qualities will benefit the group as a team. Aimed at all abilities in Year 5 and Year 6.





Astronauts will need to be quick thinkers and be able to act on unexpected problems. Lots can happen in space that you are not expecting!


NSA requires astronaut candidates to be physically fit as experiencing zero gravity can be very demanding.





Astronauts needed for a trip to the Moon

NSA (National Space Agency) is holding a selection process to recruit a group of astronauts, for a research trip to the Moon. We'd like you and your comrades to apply.

To qualify to be an astronaut, you have stiff competition. More than 18,000 people applied to join the ranks of NSA astronauts in 2016. Applicants need certain qualities to survive both NSA's selection process and space travel itself.

Astronauts need quick thinking to handle unexpected problems. They also need the intellectual creativity to dream up new opportunities of space-based research into medicine, materials and processes for use on Earth and in space. Inquisitiveness is key, as are people skills and communication skills.

Astronauts have many responsibilities in space. They need the flexibility to move from one task to another, different task. They also work on teams with other astronauts so they must be open-minded to diversity. They must be willing to change routines to accommodate new procedures. This is why we are only recruiting groups of astronauts, and not individuals. You will need to live in a small space with each other for three to six months (maybe longer).

The rigors of space travel are just about as intense as the rigors of space training. To ensure mission fitness, NSA requires astronaut candidates to pass a physical examination similar to a military physical. They also must be prepared for the physical effects of zero gravity training up to 40 times a day.

Space travel can last for months, during which the human body must function amid physical stress.


Successful candidates who make it through the physical demands of space travel must also grapple with loneliness, fear and separation from loved ones. It's not easy to live in close quarters with people, even if they are your friends!


