

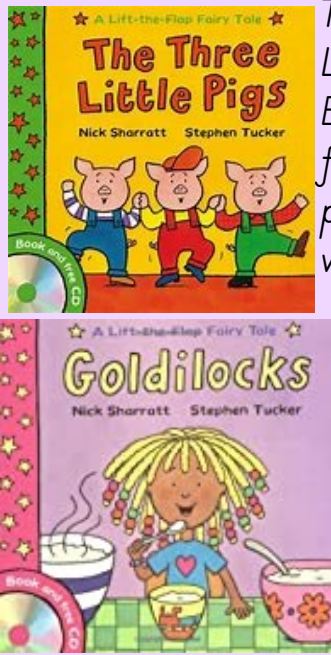


Term 4:

Will you read me a story?



Literacy



This term our core texts are: *The Three Little Pigs* and *Goldilocks* and *The Three Bears*. In our Literacy sessions we will be focusing on: sequencing a story, making porridge and using words to describe it, writing speech bubbles for the big, bad wolf and the pigs. We will also be comparing different versions of a story and looking at similarities and differences between them. At the end of the topic we will then use our knowledge of all the fairy tales we have listened to, and will be matching sentences to the correct story.

Maths

We will begin the term by comparing the length and height of objects, we will be using non-standard units to measure objects too. We will be focusing on numbers 9 and 10, comparing numbers to 10 and learning the number bonds to 10.

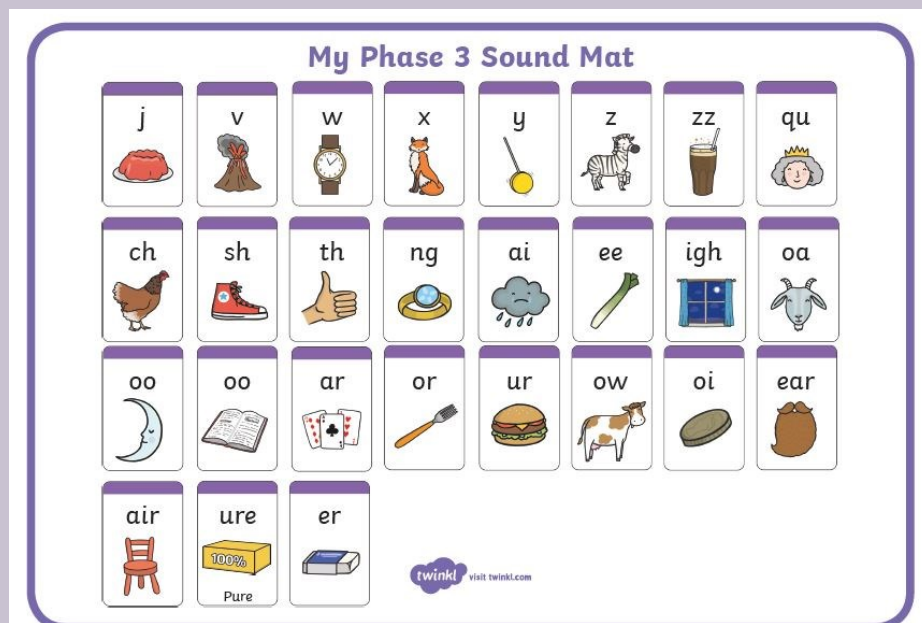


We will also learn about patterns. We will learn how to recognise, describe and create our own patterns.



Phonics

This term we will continue to learn phase 3 letters and sounds. We will be reviewing the letters and sounds we have already learned and will be learning to read longer words. We will also continue to learn the phase 3 tricky words.



Understanding the world:

We will be testing materials to see which would make the comfiest bed! We will be reading the story of 'The Giant Turnip' and will plant our own seeds, we will keep a diary to keep a record of the changes. After reading the story of 'The Gingerbread Man' we will be doing an investigation to see what would have happened if the gingerbread man had gone in the river!

Expressive Arts and Design:

We will be using different media and materials to make the three pigs houses. We will also be using natural materials to create our own magic wands to use for role play. We will be making invitations and props and will be hosting our own fairy-tale party with dancing and singing!

Our big question for the term is: Why do Christians put a cross in an Easter garden?

- Why the cross is a special symbol for Christians.
- The story of Palm Sunday
- What Christians do on Good Friday and Easter Sunday,
- The Easter Story.

Physical development:
