Upper Key Stage Two Term 6

ENGLISH

This term our English work will begin with a whole school project based on the Tin Forest. In UKS2 the children will be challenged to use figurative language to help them create alternative setting descriptions. They will then move their focus onto exploring and creating Figurative Poetry. Here they will have the opportunity to explore historical poets such as Keats, Shakespeare and Wordsworth and compare and contrast their language and style to modern poets including Pie Corbet and spike Milligan.

The children will study the novel The Giant's Necklace by Michael Morpurgo before ending the year writing story pastiche which will enable them to celebrate their literary heroes and favourite characters.

ART & DT

Our Art and DT work will focus on six different art movements from the 19th and 20th centuries: Realism, Impressionism, Expressionism, Cubism, Surrealism and Pop Art The children will explore the style of each movement, the skills and techniques developed and famous artists from each movement. The children will be provided with opportunities to practice and refine their skills within each style and will complete a school themed piece of art that demonstrates control of painting techniques, colour mixing and stylistic features from their chosen artists and art movement.

SCIENCE

Our Science learning links to our Gallery Rebels topic and will centre on Ligh.t The children will be using the Kent Scheme to develop their knowledge and understanding of what light is and how it can be seen. They will explore the work of Sir Isaac Newton and link his work on light and the colour wheel leading to the children creating their very own colour wheels using electrical circuits to create white light

There will be many opportunities to explore scientific questions and to try and find answers using practical and investigative skills and techniques.

MATHS

Our maths learning this term will vary slightly depending on year groups

Year 5 will focus on deepening their understanding and confidence with fractions, decimals and percentages in preparation for year 6.

Year 6 will be focusing on deepening their understanding of Fractions, decimals and percentages before moving onto Geometry, Ratio, Area and Perimeter, Statistics and shape and space in preparation for their transition to secondary school.

It would be very helpful if the children could continue to use Mathletics, T T Rockstars and IXL to support their studies improve their fluency and develop their reasoning skills. All login details have been supplied to pupils.

RE

All of these strategies will allow the children to build their confidence which in turn will enhance their writing skills and proficiency.
