LKS2 Hub Term 1 Curriculum Newsletter 2020

How do we walk like an Egyptian?

Home/School

<u>Literacy</u> We will start the term with a whole school transition project based on the book Here We Are by Oliver Jeffers. We will look at where we are in the whole solar system and how things have changed for us during the lockdown. We will also look at special people in our lives and how we look after our planet. Then we will start our main book Gregory Cool and look at how a young boy travels to Tobago to visit his grandparents for the first time. We will be writing character descriptions, fact files about Tobago and poems.

R.E. This term we will be following our Understanding Christianity syllabus with the theme of God and What do Christians believe God is like? We will look at the story of Jonah and the Whale and think about what Christians believe God is like from this story. The children will reenact the story and tell it in their own way. Then we will look at why at the how hymns tell us about God and we thought about why Christians sing hymns.

<u>Wider Curriculum</u> We will start looking at the Egyptians. To begin with we will understand our own timeline and then look at the Egyptian time line of main events. Then using this information we will write facts that we know and questions we would like to find out about the Egyptians.

<u>PE</u> We will be learning about three team games of rounders, volleyball and rugby. Each week the children will learn different ball skills for each sport and will then play mini games.

Art and DT We will be covering Art and DT this term. In Art the children will be learning some Egyptian art skills: creating their own Cartouche Egyptian name and Tutankhamun mask painting. In DT the children will design and make a kite linked to our Here We Are whole school project. In addition the children will design and make a model of the Evelina Hospital.

Maths

This term **Year 3 and 4** will be looking at place value of tens and ones, hundreds and thousands. We will use dienes and place value counters. We will look at 1 more and less than numbers, then 10 more and less and 100. We will also compare numbers using the greater, less than and equal signs ≤≥ =.We will place numbers on a number line and find missing numbers. The children will also be practising their times tables.

Science

We will be looing at all living things and their habitats. We will explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive. We will identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited. We will describe how different habitats provide the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants and how they depend on each other. We will identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including micro-habitats

Using our new Heart Smart programme the children will explore the emotions about coming back to school as well as how to look after ourselves and others when we have different types of feelings.

SPAG

We will be reminding the children about using capital letters to start a sentences as well for names of people, places, days of the week and months of the year. We will be using conjunctions: and, because, so when and if to extend our sentences.

The spelling rules we will be look at are suffixes -s,es, ed, er ing prefixes - un, dis,

We will also be revising Common exception words from Year 1 and 2 and we will start looking at the Year 3 and 4 Spelling words. Please see attached spelling lists on the next page.
