This symbol reminds Sikh to follow their faith and do the right thing.



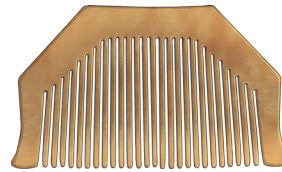
Kachera


