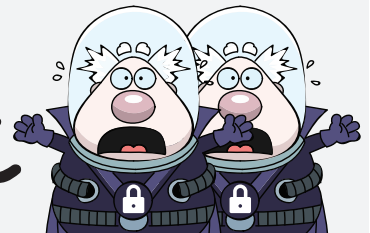

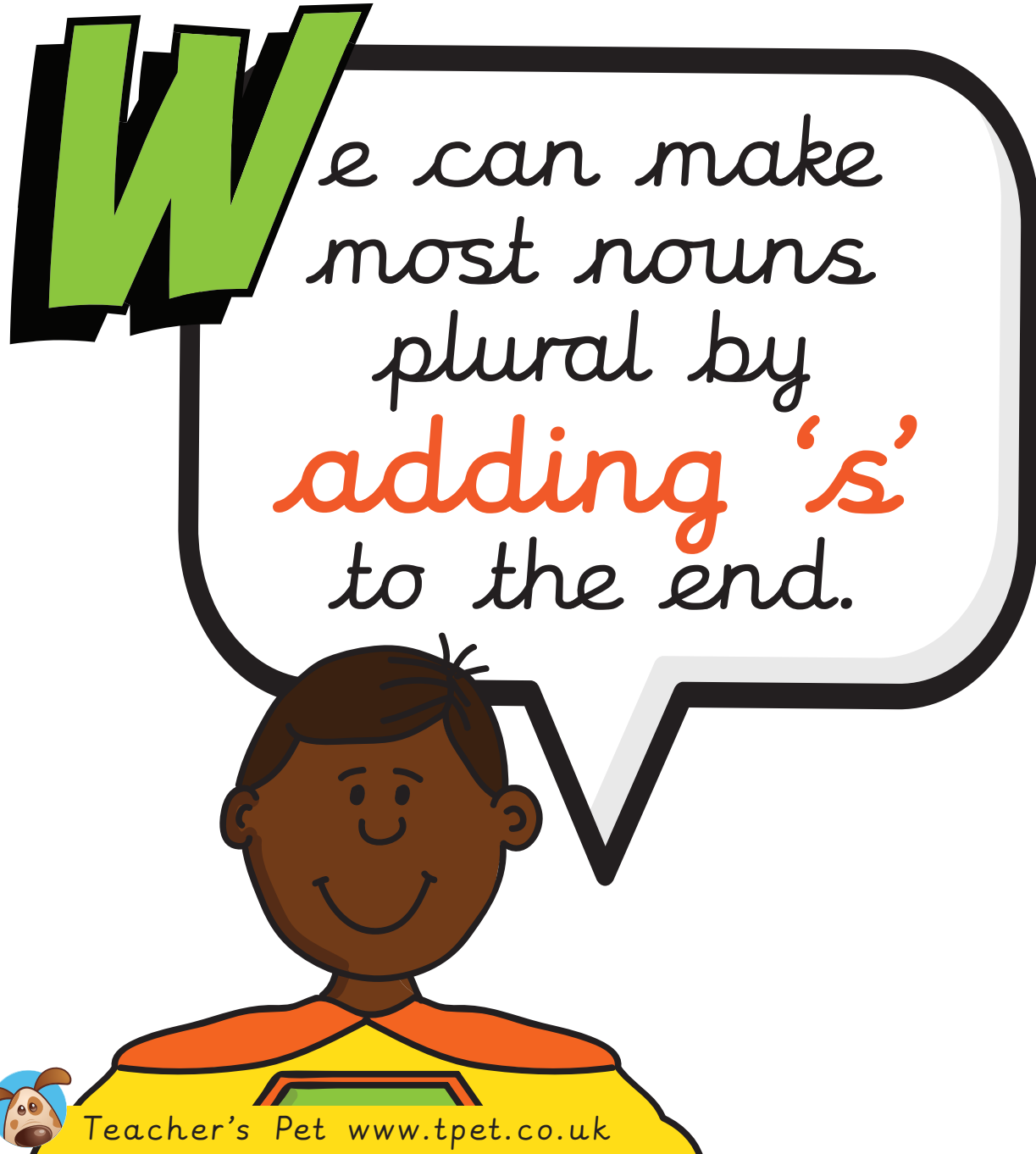
Nouns can be plural

***SUPER SPELLING TIPS** - Plural nouns*

If a noun ends in ch, sh,
s, ss or x we
usually add 'es'
to make it plural.

wisheses

kisseses

lunches

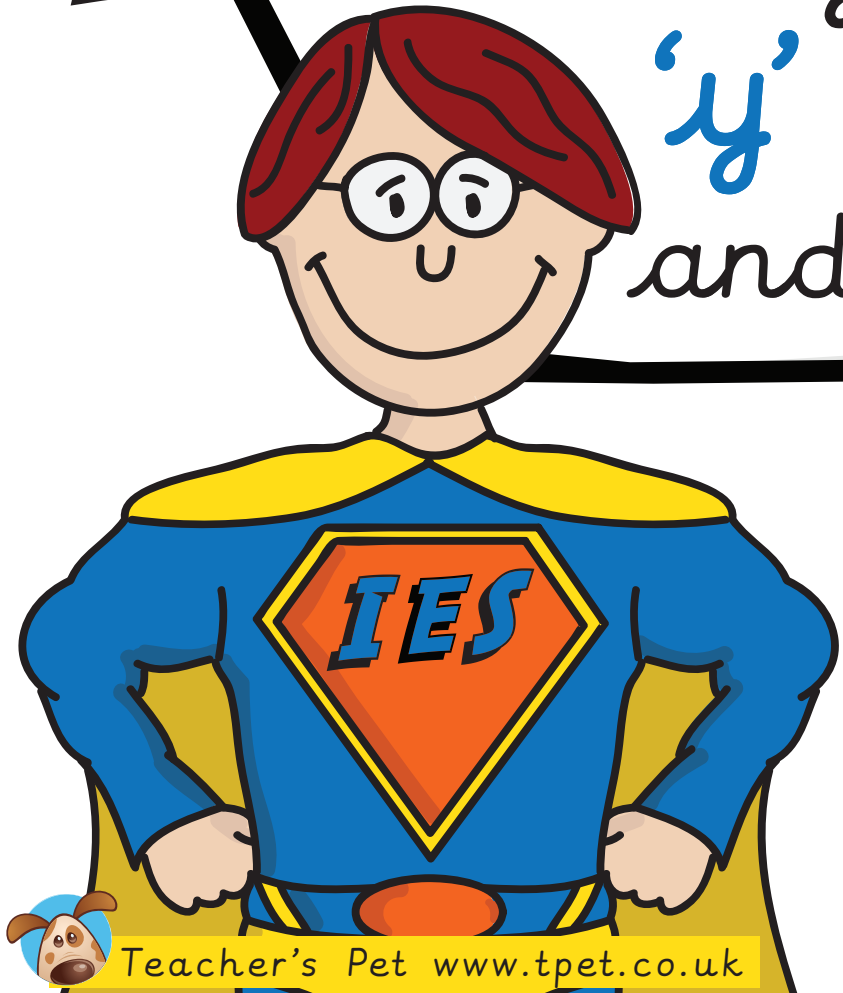
buseses

foxes



***SUPER SPELLING TIPS** - Plural nouns*

If a noun ends in a consonant and a 'y', we *swap* the 'y' for an 'i' and *add 'es'*.



memory > memories

story > stories

baby > babies



***SUPER SPELLING TIPS** - Plural nouns*

child > children

mouse > mice

leaf > leaves

goose > geese

man > men

person > people

Some tricky nouns
don't follow
any of these rules.
You just have to learn
them by heart.
