


Archbishop Courtenay Primary School School Uniform Policy

However, school uniform items with our logo can only be purchased directly from Pages Schoolwear. Please ensure all items of clothing and property, including coats, drink bottles, lunch bags etc are clearly marked with your child's name.

The school will not be held responsible for any lost or damage to personal property.

Polo Shirt*	White or Purple
	NB: polo shirts should not be worn with a tie
Short or long sleeved cotton shirt	White – can be worn with a school tie
School Sweatshirt*	Purple
Trousers Long/short	Grey
Skirt/pinafore	Grey
Summer dress	Purple and White Check or Lemon and White Check
Shoes**	Black
Socks or Tights	Plain Black, White or Grey
From September 2023 all children can wear a white cotton	

shirt and a school tie

PE KIT	
ITEMS	COLOUR
T Shirt*	House Colour (Blue=Pride, Green=Hope, Yellow=Courage, Red= Faith)
Shorts (required for gymnastics), joggers, jumpers/zip-hoodies	Black
School hoodie (optional) *	Purple
Plimsolls for indoor PE	Black
Trainers for outdoor PE	Sensible sports trainers

- ** We prefer boots over the ankle not to be worn.

Children may change shoes for outdoor play.

EYFS pupils start PE from Term 2.

JEWELLERY

Please note that for Health & Safety reasons no jewellery should be worn in school, except stud earrings, which the child must be able to remove themselves for PE.

MAKE-UP

No make-up, including nail varnish.

HAIR

Long hair should be tied up.

RELIGIOUS AND MEDICAL EXCEPTIONS

If a pupil should need to wear a headscarf or other religious-based hair covering, please bring this to the attention of the Headteacher.
