

EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE

We cannot believe it is the end of Term 5 already!! This week in Literacy we have been completing our stories of 'What the Ladybird Heard'. We began by thinking about the beginning, middle and end of the story, and we then used our knowledge to help us with our illustrations, we thought very carefully about making sure the ladybird was on each page! We then wrote short sentences for each part of the story, using our phonics knowledge to help us segment the sounds in words. This week we had to make sure we used finger spaces in our writing to help us be successful.

In Maths we have been combining shapes to create a different shape. We investigated how we could make a rectangle using two triangles, and how we could use smaller squares to make a rectangle. We really enjoyed seeing how we could create shapes from other shapes, and it really made us think about the positioning of them.

In our topic lesson this week we have been learning about sheep dogs and their role on the farm. We watched a video showing their work and listened to the different commands the farmer gave the dog to herd the sheep. We then got to have a go ourselves, which was very exciting! We took on either the role of the sheep, farmer or the dog and either had to give clear instructions or listen and follow the instructions so we got in the pen safely!

KEY STAGE ONE

In English this week we read the book The Day the Crayons Quit by Drew Daywalt, we all giggled at poor Peach crayon's plight (ask us why!) The Year 2s wrote a persuasive argument for their favourite crayon, giving reasons for their argument. Then they wrote an apology letter in role as Duncan to the crayon of their choice before describing the colours in poetry – one rhyming and another using metaphors and similes. Year 1s made inferences about the feelings of the crayons and used adjectives to describe the characters. Then they wrote a summary of the story and letters to the class whiteboard pens apologising for treating them badly.

In Maths Year 2s started the unit on statistics by drawing and interpreting tally charts and pictograms while Year 1s were revisiting place value within 50, partitioning using tens and ones and representing numbers in different ways.

In History we created a poster of our favourite nurse to remind everyone why they were important and in R.E. we learnt about mosques and built models with Lego to represent them.

We are so proud of the Key Stage 1 children and how hard they have worked this Term.

We hope you all have a wonderful Half Term break and look forward to doing it all again in Term 6.

LOWER KEY STAGE TWO

We cannot believe we are at the end of Term 5 – it has been a good term of learning and the children have thoroughly enjoyed our topic of Raiders and Traders (Anglo Saxons). This week the children have been including speech into their narratives to move the story on. We are so pleased that many of the children are using paragraphs in their writing too. In Maths Year 3 have been counting in fractions and finding equivalent fractions to a half and two quarters. Year 4 have been ordering and comparing fractions.

Continuing with our World Faith of Hinduism the children have been looking at Gandhi who is a father figure for Hindus and they looked at the meanings of some of his famous quotes as well as how he lived his life as a Hindu. The children enjoyed exploring pitch this week in science by making straw whistles and playing recorders. We learnt how low and high pitch sounds can be created. In History we have rounded off our topic and looked at artefacts from the Anglo-Saxon times from a loan box through our local library. The children enjoyed making their pneumatic monsters last week and this week they have brought them home after evaluating them. We have also completed our term of learning about attacking and defending in small games of netball and football and the children have certainly improved their skills of throwing and catching using the chest, bounce and overhead pass. What a great Term we have had in LKS2 and we look forward to another exciting Term of learning. We will be following a Whole School project of reading the book The Tin Forest by Helen Ward and Wayne Anderson during the first week back. We hope you have a restful Half Term holiday and enjoy the sunshine!

UPPER KEY STAGE TWO

For our final week of term, Year 6 have been writing a diary entry from a short video clip from Literacy Shed about a father and son trip to hunt an elusive whale. The writing has been superb as we've explored techniques such as pathetic fallacy (where the weather reflects the character's mood) and words such as juxtaposed. We've also continued to work through the gaps in our curriculum ready for the Maths SATS by covering factors and prime numbers, algebra and BODMAS. We auditioned for our roles in the Year 6 production today and roles were assigned, ready to practice over half-term. We also sent a link for you to purchase your Year 6 leaver's hoodie ready for the final couple of weeks of the school year!

In Year 5, we've been continuing to read through Tom's Midnight Garden and writing short stories with a twist in the plot. In Maths, we've been working hard at understanding decimals and sequencing them. Through RE lessons, we have been researching comparative religions (with a focus on Islam). At the start of the week our children completed their CATS tests, the results of which are ready to share with parents from the office. This is a great indicator for success in the 11+ (PESE) exams during the first week back in September.

We have been looking at how Christians explore and use creativity and art as their worship to God. We began the week with: Isaiah 55:12
