

1 Out of Character

Using the senses...

- · What can you hear?
- What can you feel? Example: the weather, how you feel by being there or something you touch.
 - What can you taste? · What can you smell?
 - ·What can you see?

This helps the reader to imagine they are there.


How you start your story is very important. The first few lines are essential because they make the reader want to read on. This is known as a 'hook'.
