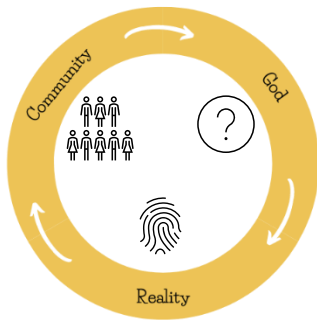




Was Jesus the Messiah?





How does learning about religion cause believers and you to explore, question and challenge an understanding of the world and your place in it?

Key Vocabulary	
Messiah 	A special person chosen by God to bring hope, peace, and freedom — Christians believe Jesus is the Messiah.
Prophecy Prophet 	A prophecy is a message from God given through someone called a prophet.
Anointed 	Anointed means chosen and specially blessed by God for an important job. Christians believe Jesus was anointed by God.
Fulfil Fulfilment Fulfilled 	Christians believe that Jesus fulfilled God's promises. This means he made them come true by doing what God had said the Messiah would do.
Saviour 	Saviour means someone who saves or rescues others from danger or harm. In Christianity, Jesus is called the Saviour because Christians believe he saves people from sin and helps them be close to God.

Key Knowledge
Jesus was Jewish.
Christians believe Jesus is God in the flesh.
They believe that his birth, life, death and resurrection were part of a longer plan by God to restore the relationship between humans and God.
The Old Testament talks about a 'rescuer' or 'anointed one' — a messiah. Some texts talk about what this 'messiah' would be like.
Christians believe that Jesus fulfilled these expectations, and that he is the Messiah. (Jewish people do not think Jesus is the Messiah.)
Christians see Jesus as their Saviour.
