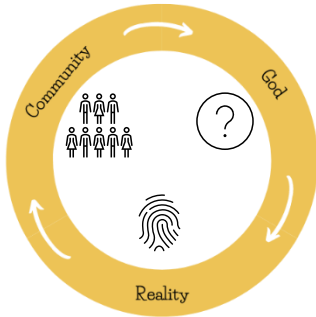




What would Jesus do?

Key Vocabulary	
Gospel 	Gospel means 'good news'.
Disciple Discipleship 	'Disciple' literally means 'learner'. For Christians, discipleship means becoming more like Jesus, through the power of the Holy Spirit.
Community 	A Christian community is a group of people who care for and help each other, like Jesus taught.
Justice 	Justice means treating everyone fairly and making sure people are cared for. Christians believe Jesus taught that justice is part of God's Kingdom — where everyone is valued, people are honest and kind, and wrong things are made right.
Service Serve 	Service means helping others with kindness and love, without expecting anything in return
Forgiveness 	Forgiveness means letting go of anger or hurt when someone has done something wrong. Christians believe Jesus taught and showed forgiveness, even to those who hurt him, and that God forgives people when they say sorry — so they should also forgive others.

Key Knowledge
The good news is not just about setting an example for good behaviour and challenging bad behaviour: it is that Jesus offers a way to heal the damage done by human sin.
Christians see that Jesus' teachings and example cut across expectations — the Sermon on the Mount is an example of this, where Jesus' values favour serving the weak and vulnerable, not making people comfortable.
Christians believe that they should bring this good news to life in the world in different ways, within their church family, in their personal lives, with family, with their neighbours, in the local, national and global community.
