KS1 TERM 4 2025/2026

ENGLISH

This term we will be continuing to help Professor Klunk and the Faithful Friends on their Curious Quest. The children will think about suggestions to help the Faithful Friends overcome the challenges they face to continue with the quest. The children's writing will be sent back to Professor Klunk through the portal. The children will be continuing to practise forming sentences using a capital letter and a full stop.

MATHS

This term, we will be focusing on the topics of geometry, place value, addition and subtraction, money and multiplication and division. The children will begin to understand the difference between tens and ones, the differences between notes and coins and the values of each and also how we use arrays to help with multiplication and division facts when counting in 2's, 5's and

10's

DT

This term we will focus on construction and moving monsters. The children will be designing their own monster and then using different materials and techniques to construct their own moving monster.

MUSIC

This term we will be looking at a unit called 'Dawn' from Sea Interludes. Children will listen actively to music inspired by the sea. They will use percussion instruments to represent sounds by the sea and listen to contrasting themes in 'Dawn' from Benjamin Britten's Sea Interludes.

SCIENCE

In this unit we will learn about sustainability and understanding the idea that humans must interact with the environment in a way that ensures there will be enough resources left for future generations. We will also be exploring the different parts of plants.

GEOGRAPHY

This term we will be learning that the world is made up of many countries. The countries can be grouped into continents. The large amounts of water between each continent are called oceans. Some of the continents are joined by land. Others are separated by oceans. Human features are made by people. Physical features are created by nature.

PE

Our Outdoor focus is ball skills using our hands. Our Indoor focus is dance, children will respond to rhythm and patterns through their movement.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Our focus this term is 'Salvation' we will be looking at why Easter is a special time for Christians. We will be exploring the Easter story and how Christians believe that Jesus died and rose again.
